AFFIRMING ORDINANCE NO. 04 DATED FEBRUARY 3, 2026 OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF LIANGA, THIS PROVINCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE STRENGTHENING THE BARANGAY TANODS OF LIANGA, SURIGAO DEL SUR BY DEFINING THEIR ROLES, GRANTING BENEFITS AND CASH INCENTIVES AND PROVIDING FUNDS THEREOF", IT BEING WITHIN THE SCOPE OF THE PRESCRIBED POWERS OF THE SANGGUNIAN BAYAN CONCERNED TO ENACT SUCH ORDINANCE PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 04 dated February 3, 2026 of the Municipality of Lianga, this Province entitled "An Ordinance Strengthening the Barangay Tanods of Lianga, Surigao del Sur by Defining Their Roles, Granting Benefits and Cash Incentives and Providing Funds Thereof", was submitted to this Body for review and same was referred to the Committees on Public Works and Infrastructure (Lead Committee)/Disaster Risk Reduction and Climate Change Adaptation, for appropriate action;

WHEREAS, after a careful review by the Committee to which the matter was referred to, it was found out that it is within the ambit of the provisions of the Local Government Code of 1991;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Surigao del Sur to affirm Ordinance No. 04 dated February 3, 2026 of the Municipality of Lianga, this Province entitled "An Ordinance Strengthening the Barangay Tanods of Lianga, Surigao del Sur by Defining Their Roles, Granting Benefits and Cash Incentives and Providing Funds Thereof", it being within the scope of the prescribed powers of the Sangguniang Bayan concerned to enact such Ordinance pursuant to the Local Government Code of 1991.
