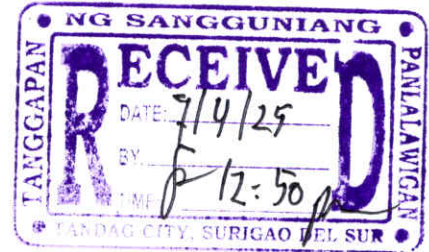

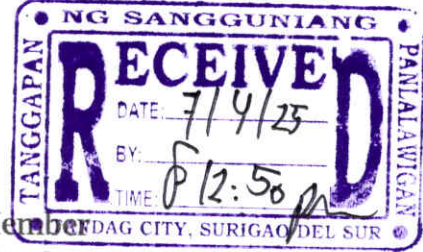

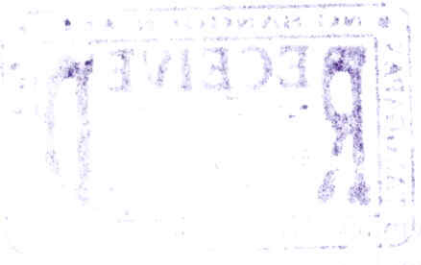

The data shows that the percentage of correct responses increases as the number of trials increases, indicating that the subject is learning the task.

The results of the experiment show that the subject's performance is stable after approximately 40 trials. The percentage of correct responses fluctuates around 55-60%, suggesting that the subject has reached a level of automaticity in the task.





WHEREAS, Section 107 of RA 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code (LGC) of 1991 provides for the composition of a multi-sectoral body known as the Local Development Council (LDC) which is tasked to assist the Sangguniang Bayan in setting the direction of the economic and social development and coordinates the development efforts of the municipality;

WHEREAS, The Municipal Development Council (MDC) of the Local Government Unit of Barobo, Surigao del Sur conducted their First Semestral Meeting last April 14, 2025 at Kvenz Place, Puork 2, Poblacion, Barobo, Surigao del Sur to discussed matters relative to their task as special body of the Local Government Unit (LGU).

WHEREAS, The members of the Municipal Development Council (MDC) were informed on the guidelines for AIP Program, Projects and Activities (PPAs) identification and the utilization of the 20% Development Funds as stated in DILG-DBM Joint Memorandum Circular (JMC) No. 2017-1 dated February 22, 2017 which was further supplemented by Joint Memorandum Circular (JMC) No. 1 dated March 27, 2020.

WHEREAS, The members of the Municipal Development Council (MDC) were presented with the draft for the 2026 Annual Investment Program (AIP) by the Municipal Planning and Development Coordinator, For. Samuel M. Ortega, Head of the



AIP Brief on Climate Change

The main goal of the Republic Act 9729 otherwise known as the "Philippine Climate Change Act (CCA) of 2009" is to mainstream climate change in policy formulation, development plans, poverty reduction strategies and programs and projects by all units of government. Section 14 of the Act recognizes that LGUs are at the frontline for climate change action requiring them to formulate and implement local climate change action plan (LCCAP) for their respective areas, consistent with the national, regional, and provincial frameworks on climate change. Complementing the CCA, the Republic Act 10121 otherwise known as the "Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010" was passed. Section 2 (g) of the said act provides that disaster risk reduction and climate change needs be mainstreamed in development processes while Sec 12 (c) 6 requires LGUs to formulate and implement a comprehensive and integrated Local Disaster Risk Reduction Management Plan in accordance with the national, regional and provincial framework, and policies on disaster risk reduction.

The DBM on the other hand issued Local Budget Memorandum No. 70 which asks LGUs to identify, tag and prioritize climate change programs. Also, Joint Memorandum Circular 2015-01 was issued by the DBM, CCC, and DILG which provides the guidelines to LGUs in Climate Change Expenditure Tagging (CCET) of their Annual Investment Programs (AIP).

This AIP Brief describes the various climate change adaptation and mitigation programmed expenditures of the municipality for FY 2026. It also highlights the alignment of the investments to the National Climate Change Action Plan and the various sources of funds that the LGU has mobilized to support these initiatives.

Hazard and Vulnerability Analysis

The Municipality of Barobo is located along the coast of the Province of Surigao del Sur. It lies within 8°34'00" to 8°25'06" latitude and 125°59'00" to 126°22'00" longitude. It is bounded on the north by the Pacific Ocean and the Municipality of Lianga, on the south by the Municipality of Tagbina, on the east by the Municipality of Hinatuan, and on the west by the Municipality of San Francisco, Agusan del Sur.

CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The following recommendations are provided to guide the implementation of the discussed principles:





The hazard and vulnerability of the barangays are described below as follows:

a. Landslides

The areas in Barangays Tambis, Campbagang, Sudlon, Amaga, Bahi, and the mountainous portion of Cabacungan and Gamut are considered landslide-prone because of its steep and rugged terrain that have been stripped of major forest vegetation.

b. Storm Surge

The nine (9) coastal barangays are prone to storm surge and/or tsunami based on the disaster map drawn up by the National Disaster Coordinating Council (NDCC) as these barangays are facing the Pacific Ocean. This has been evident in the number of storm surges that had happened particularly along Panaraga areas in Barangay Unidat and Gamut and in Barangay Kinayan, Rizal, and Wakat.

c. Flood

The low-lying areas at barangays Campbagang, Bahi, Tambis, San Jose, Gamut, Javier, San Vicente and Poblacion are the identified flood-prone areas of the municipality. Floods in these areas recede after about between one and four hours. With the establishment of concrete canals in the Poblacion about four years, flooding has improved a lot as waters are contained in deep canals and re-channeled to Barobo River. There is an urgent need to dredge Tambis River which has become heavily silted due to erosion of soil and forest debris from upstream areas. During strong rains, Tambis River overflows its banks and floods adjacent built-up areas and agricultural areas in the aforementioned barangays.

For the year 2023, the municipality has not experienced any majorly destructive hydrometeorological disaster although there have been major earthquake (geologic) incidents in December of 2023 the neighboring municipality of Hinatuan as the epicenter, thereby causing strong tremors in Barobo. Ultimately, the most common emergency cases encountered by the MDRRM Office is vehicular accidents.

Climate Change Investments

The LGU's total Annual Investment Program fund for FY 2026 is presented in the figure below. Climate change related expenditures comprise 69.98% of the AIP (see Figure 1 below). The municipality has mainstreamed climate change into its Annual

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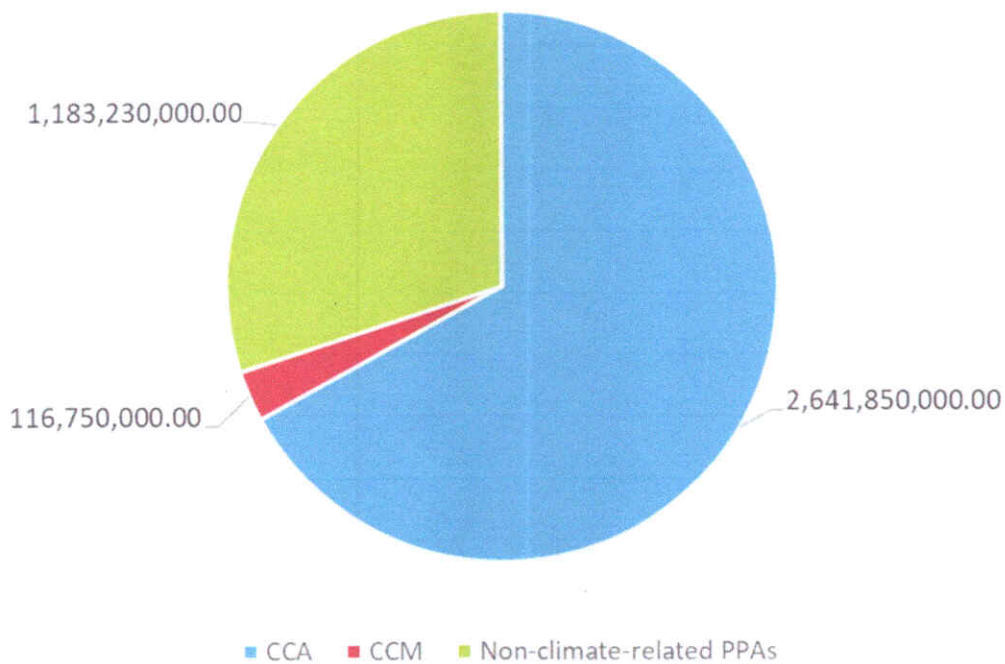

Most programmed investments for CC identified by the municipality for 2026 are directed towards CCA adaptation at 95.77% (see Figure 2).

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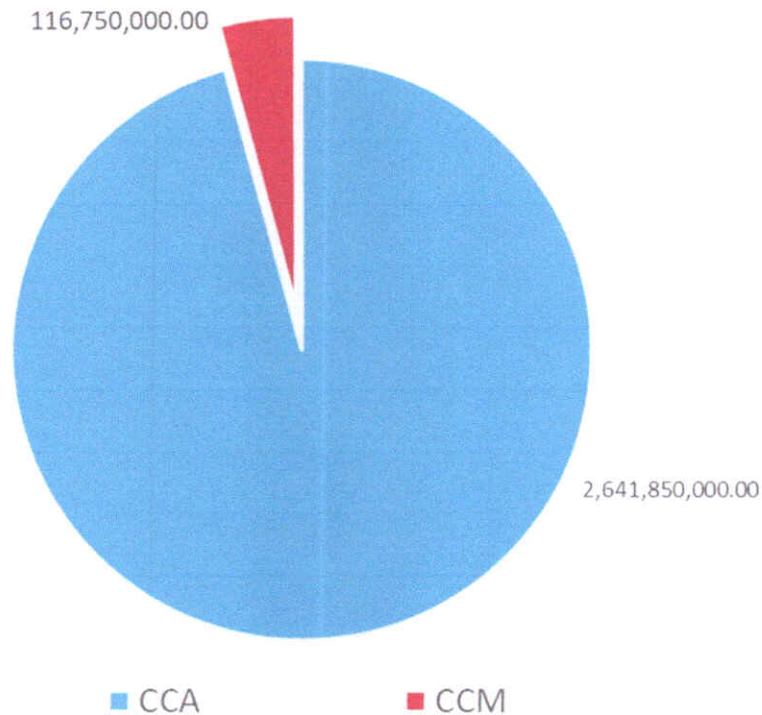
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Figure 2: Share of CCM and CCA Expenditure



Climate Change Adaptation

Most climate change adaptation measures identified in the AIP are more on structural responses to improve the resilience of government infrastructure (i.e. road repairs, concreting and opening) to climate change and climate variability. This infrastructure supports the economic upliftment program particularly the farm-to-market roads for the delivery and hauling of farm inputs and products. This is followed by the provision of social support to the community. The top CCA investments programmed for 2026 are the following:

- Upgrade existing roads, ports and aviation infrastructure to climate resilient design standards (A634-04)
- Development of social protection strategies to respond to climate change and climate variability (A414-06)
- Climate proofing/retrofitting or relocating of government infrastructure (i.e. schools and government hospitals, health centers, rural health units, teen centers) from climate hazards (A424-12)

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Climate Change Mitigation

The LGU has identified climate change mitigation (CCM) measures that help sequester and reduce greenhouse gas emissions such as carbon dioxide and methane. These include actions that reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions (solid waste management). The CCM programmed investments for FY 2026 are:

- Construction of Multipurpose Waste Processing Building.
- Construction of Clustered Barangay Central Materials Recovery Facilities (MRFs).
- Procurement of Thermal Decomposition System.

Alignment with National Climate Change Action Plan

The LGU's CY 2026 AIP supports implementation of a number of National Climate Change Action Plan (NCCAP) priorities. Climate initiatives are more on sustainable energy. Budget is also set aside for human security and ecological and environmental stability.



8. Further research is needed to confirm these results and explore the underlying mechanisms.

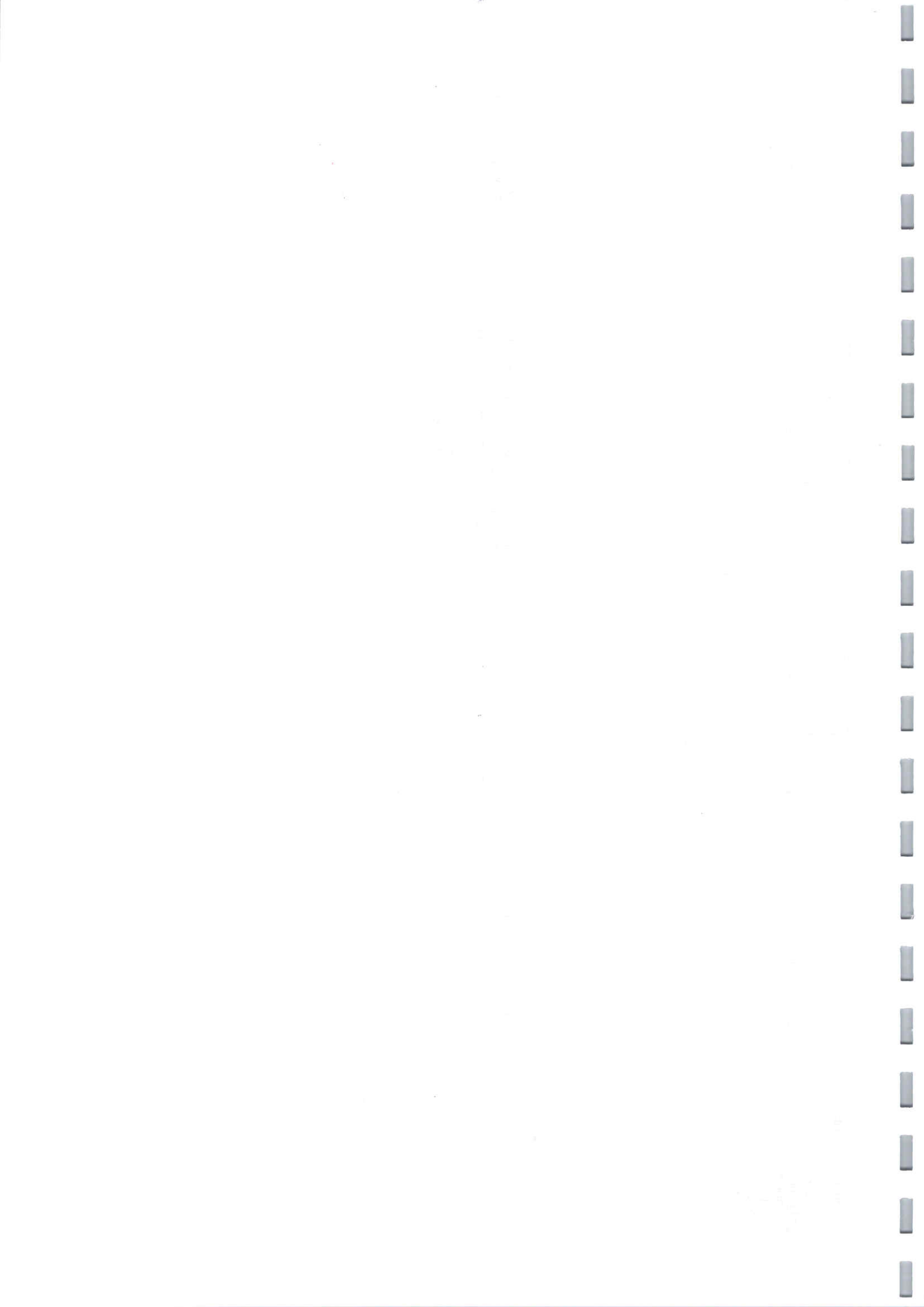
