WHEREAS, DILG Memorandum Circulars No. 2003-42 and No. 2018-144 call for the reorganization, strengthening, and institutionalization of BPATs to assist in peacekeeping and emergency response efforts at the barangay level;

WHEREAS, Barangay Peacekeeping Action Team (BPAT), as force multipliers, play a critical role in crime prevention, community policing, traffic management, and disaster response support;

WHEREAS, there is a need to institutionalize BPAT in the Municipality of Marikhatag to promote public safety, support law enforcement, and provide recognition and incentives for their voluntary service;

NOW THEREFORE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Bayan of Marikhatag, in session assembled, that:

SECTION 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as the **“Marikhatag Barangay Peacekeeping Action Team (BPAT) Ordinance of 2026.”**

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY. It is the policy of the Municipality of Marikhatag to promote peace, order, and public safety by recognizing, organizing, training, and equipping BPAT as active partners of the local government and law enforcement agencies in maintaining community security.

SECTION 3. COVERAGE. This Ordinance shall apply to all barangays within the Municipality of Marikhatag. Each barangay shall organize its own BPAT in accordance with the guidelines herein.

SECTION 4. DEFINITION OF TERMS. For this ordinance, the following terms are hereby defined, to wit:

4.1 **Barangay Peacekeeping Action Team (BPAT)** – composed of volunteer individuals from the community who assist barangay officials and law enforcement in ensuring peace and order.

4.2 **Barangay Peace and Order Committee (BPOC)** – A barangay-level body that supervises the BPATS.

4.3 **Force Multiplier** – A support unit that aids law enforcement agencies in operations such as patrolling, traffic control, and public event security.

SECTION 5. COMPOSITION AND QUALIFICATION OF BPAT. Each barangay shall establish a BPAT composed of 10 to 20 members, which should be equitable depending on the size and needs of the area. Members must:

- 5.1 Be a resident of the barangay;
- 5.2 Be physically fit and of good moral character;
- 5.3 Be at least 18 years old but not more than 60 years old;
- 5.4 Not be convicted of any crime involving moral turpitude; and
- 5.5 Willing to undergo training as required.

SECTION 6. DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS. BPAT members shall:

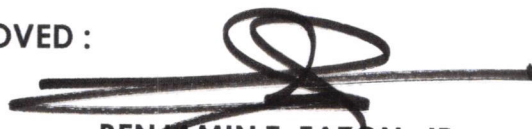
- 6.1 Conduct foot or mobile patrols in coordination with barangay officials and PNP;
- 6.2 Report crimes, suspicious activities, and disturbances;
- 6.3 Assist in maintaining peace during public gatherings and fiestas;
- 6.4 Support traffic management within barangay roads;
- 6.5 Assist during disasters, emergencies, and evacuation efforts;
- 6.6 Assist in the implementation of Municipal and Barangay Ordinances
- 6.7 Serve as community information officers for peace and safety programs.

SECTION 7. TRAINING AND ORIENTATION. The Municipal Peace and Order Council (MPOC), in coordination with the Philippine National Police (PNP), Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP), and Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction Management Office (MDRRMO), shall provide regular training to all BPAT members. Training topics include basic law enforcement, first aid, human rights, conflict mediation, disaster response, and gender sensitivity.

SECTION 8. UNIFORM, EQUIPMENT, AND IDENTIFICATION. Each BPATS member shall be issued:

- 8.1 An official BPAT Identification Card (ID), signed by the Punong Barangay and the Mayor;
- 8.2 A standard uniform or vest, bearing the name and logo of the Municipality and Barangay; and

- 8.3 Basic equipment such as flashlight, whistle, baton, and logbook (subject to budget availability).

SECTION 9. SUPPORT AND INCENTIVES. To recognize their voluntary service, the following support shall be provided to BPAT members:

- 9.1 The honorarium shall be determined by the Local Chief Executive, subject to the availability of funds, but in no case shall it exceed One Thousand Pesos (₱1,000.00).
- 9.2 Access to insurance coverage for accidents while performing duty (if funds allow).
- 9.3 Certificates of Recognition for exemplary service.
- 9.4 Priority access to municipal livelihood programs or skills training.

Provided That, the Barangays are encouraged to allocate a portion of their annual budget for BPAT support, subject to COA and DILG guidelines.

SECTION 10. MONITORING AND SUPERVISION.

- 10.1 The Barangay Peace and Order Committee (BPOC) shall directly supervise BPAT operations at the barangay level.
- 10.2 The Municipal Mayor or his/her authorized representative, through the Municipal Local Government Operations Officer (MLGOO), shall monitor implementation and compliance across barangays.

SECTION 11. PENALTIES. Any BPAT member found guilty of abuse of authority, harassment, or other misconduct shall be:

- 11.1 Given a written warning for the first offense;
- 11.2 Suspended or dismissed from service by the BPOC for subsequent or grave offenses;
- 11.3 Recommended for criminal or administrative charges if warranted.

SECTION 12. APPROPRIATION. Funds shall be allocated from the Municipal Peace and Order Fund for training, uniforms, and equipment. Barangays shall also include BPATS support in their Annual Investment Plan.

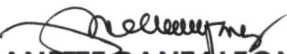
SECTION 13. AUTHORITY OF THE MAYOR. The Municipal Mayor shall oversee and ensure the full and effective implementation of this Ordinance. The Mayor is hereby authorized to issue Executive Orders, administrative guidelines, and implementing rules; mobilize concerned municipal departments; require reports from barangays; and undertake measures necessary to support and strengthen BPAT operations, subject to existing laws and regulations.

SECTION 14. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any part of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 15. EFFECTIVITY. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval and compliance with publication/posting requirements under R.A. 7160.

WHEREAS, the Marikhatag Peacekeeping Action Team (BPAT) is an active institution that is critical to crime prevention, community justice, traffic management, and disaster response support;
WHEREAS, there is a need to institutionalize BPAT in the Municipality of Marikhatag to provide public safety, support law enforcement, and provide recognition and incentives for their voluntary service;
NOW THEREFORE
BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Bayan of Marikhatag, in session assembled, that
SECTION 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as the "Marikhatag Barangay Peacekeeping Action Team (BPAT) Ordinance of 2026."

1.3 be at least 18 years old but not more than 60 years old;
1.4 not be employed or involved in any other business that may interfere with the duties and responsibilities of the BPAT;
1.5 willing to undergo training or education.
SECTION 6. DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS. BPAT members shall:
6.1 Conduct foot or mobile patrol in coordination with barangay officials and police;
6.2 Report crimes, suspicious activities, and disturbances;
6.3 Assist in maintaining peace during public gatherings and events;
6.4 Support traffic management with barangay roads;

8.1 The barangay shall be determined by the Sangguniang Bayan, subject to the availability of funds, but in no case shall it exceed one thousand pesos (P1,000.00);
8.2 Access to insurance coverage for all BPAT members during duty or while on duty;
8.3 Certificate of Appreciation and honorarium;
8.4 Priority access to municipal health services, including medical assistance.
Provided That, the Barangay shall encourage its citizens to provide in-kind support for BPAT support, subject to OGC and DDC guidelines.
SECTION 9. MONITORING AND SUPERVISION.
9.1 The Barangay Peace and Order Committee (BPAC) shall directly supervise BPAT operations at the barangay level;
9.2 The Municipal Mayor or his/her authorized representative, through the Municipal Disaster Management Office (MDRMO), shall monitor, supervise, and coordinate the BPAT activities.
SECTION 10. PENALTY. Any BPAT member found guilty of abuse of authority, harassment, or other misconduct shall be:
10.1 Given a written warning for the first offense.
