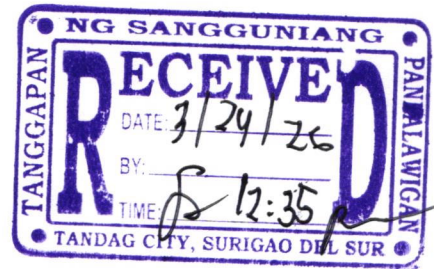

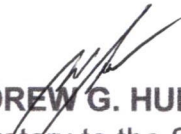

and to ensure that its citizens are protected from acts of violence, intimidation, or unlawful coercion by regulating and penalizing the possession of deadly weapons;

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Barangay Bayan recognizes the need to strengthen Ordinance No.12-1993 by amending its penalty provisions to provide stiffer fines and sanctions, thereby deterring potential offenders and promoting accountability among violators;

WHEREAS, it is necessary to adopt measures that not only penalize violators but also provide incentives to barangays and law enforcement agencies for effective implementation and enforcement of peace and order initiatives;

WHEREAS, the preservation of peace, safety, and public order is a shared responsibility of the community, the barangay, the municipal government, and the law enforcement authorities, and thus requires a firm legal framework to guide its enforcement;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Bayan of Cantilan, Surigao del Sur, in session assembled, that:

SECTION 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as the "Imposing Penalty of Persons Apprehended for Possession of Deadly Weapon Ordinance."

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY. It is the policy of the Municipality of Cantilan to ensure peace and order, and to protect its citizens from violence and intimidation by penalizing the unlawful possession of deadly weapons in public places.

SECTION 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS.

Deadly Weapon - Any instrument or object capable of inflicting serious bodily harm or death, including but not limited to firearms, bladed weapons (e.g., knives, swords), blunt instruments, and improvised weapons.

Public Place - Any area accessible to the general public, including streets, parks, markets, schools, and government buildings.

Possession - Physical or constructive control over a deadly weapon, whether concealed or openly carried.

SECTION 4. PROHIBITED ACTS

It shall be unlawful for any person to possess, carry, or transport any deadly weapon within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality of Cantilan, especially in public places, unless duly authorized by law or in the performance of official duties.

SECTION 5. ENFORCEMENT

The Philippine National Police (PNP), Barangay Tanods, and other deputized law enforcement officers shall be responsible for the enforcement of this ordinance.

SECTION 6. AIMING OF A DEADLY WEAPON

The aiming of any deadly weapon, whether loaded or not, at or toward any human being is hereby prohibited.

SECTION 7. TURNOVER OF APPREHENDED PERSONS

First Offense: An administrative fine of five hundred pesos (P500.00) shall be imposed. In the event that the fine cannot be paid, he/she shall render eight (8) hours of community service as an alternative.

Second Offense: A fine of one thousand pesos (P1,000.00) or imprisonment of not less than one (1) month but not more than one (1) year.

Third offense: A fine of two thousand pesos (P2,000.00) or imprisonment of not less than one (1) month but not more than one (1) year.

SECTION 9. INCENTIVE TO BARANGAY

Persons of authority, agents of the person of authority, or any citizen responsible for an apprehension resulting in the payment of a fine herein provided shall be awarded an incentive: 50% shall accrue to the Barangay LGU where the apprehension was made, and 50% shall accrue to the General Fund of the Municipality of Cantilan.

SECTION 10. DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS

The share of the Barangay LGU and the Municipal Government, as provided under the preceding section, shall be released and disbursed on a quarterly basis. The Barangay Treasurer shall ensure that the barangay's share is duly recorded and credited to the Peace and Order Fund, while the Municipal Treasurer shall account for the municipal share under the General Fund. Proper liquidation and reporting shall be made in accordance with existing auditing and accounting rules and regulations.

SECTION 11. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE

If for any reason, any provision of this ordinance is declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect or impair the remaining provisions which shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 12. REPEALING CLAUSE

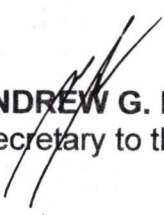
All Ordinances, rules, and regulations or parts thereof in conflict with or inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 13. EFFECTIVITY

This Ordinance shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication and posting in at least three (3) conspicuous public places within the Municipality of Cantilan.

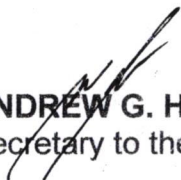

EXCERPT FROM THE MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARING HELD AT CANTILAN
SPORTING CLUB COVERED COURT LAST 22 DECEMBER 2025

- (1) **CALL TO ORDER:** The meeting was called to order at 2:00 in the afternoon.
(2) **OPENING PRAYER:** Led by SB Member Lorna G. Almeda.
(3) **ROLL CALL:** With seven (7) members present, Chair declared the public hearing in quorum.

Vice Mayor Liberty G. Cale made a statement about the purpose of the said Public Hearing. She also welcomed the presence of guests ranging from Barangay Captains from the different barangays. Thereafter, she gave the floor to Hon. Marlo B. Arreza, the sponsor of the 1st Ordinance for his explanation.

1. AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING GUIDELINES FOR THE SYSTEMATICE NAMING AND RENAMING OF THOROUGHFARES IN THE POBLACION OF CANTILAN AND PROVIDING FUNDS THEREOF.

SB Member Marlo B. Arreza explained the purpose of the proposed ordinance. He mentioned that the proposal was timely because the street names in Cantilan was made long years back. There is also confusions as to real street name of a certain street that is why there was a need to update.

SB Member Marlo B. Arreza informed the participants that the street name proposals was initiated by the Sangguniang Bayan with the help of some resource persons namely:

1. HANS BUCALON
2. EMMA HOTCHKISS
3. FRANCIS CARMELLE DUERO

SB Member Marlo B. Arreza then gave the floor to Mr. Hans Bucalon, one of the resource persons to discuss in detail the proposed street names with their corresponding importance.

Mr. Hans Bucalon read the Ordinance in whole and mentioned all the proposed street names and where it is located.

Vice Mayor Liberty Cale asked whom the streets be named.

Ms. Emma Y. Hotchkiss explained that the streets won't be named to some "politicos" as the street names will be based on the historical significance of the person to whom it will be named.

Mr. Hans Bucalon added that there are a number of possible street names but they limit the street names to those who are founders and contributors to the development of Cantilan.

After discussing the Ordinance, SB Member Marlo B. Arreza, invited the participants for open forum.

Brgy. Captain Armando Arizobal suggested to include the new streets in San Pedro to be given street names as well in preparation for the future.

SB Member Marlo B. Arreza told Hon. Arizobal that the street names at the barangays will follow after the street names in the población area will be finalized.

SB Member Romeo Emmanuel Azarcon asked the resource persons if the limitations in the usage of names of politicians are based on National Law or based only on the recommendation of the ad hoc committee.

Mr. Hans Bucalon answered that the street names to be used was based on the guidelines set by the National Historical Commission.

Miss Emma Hotchkiss the some street names has significance as they gave pride to the Philippines and what needs to be avoided is that it will be politicized.

SB Member Romeo Emmanuel Azarcon emphasized that during the previous meetings held for the purpose, the names of former mayors were still included specifically Azarcon Street which now been replaced in the proposal to Guazon Street. He suggested that instead of Azarcon Street, the same will be named Levi M. Azarcon street in honor of former mayor Levi M. Azarcon who was instrumental in the reclamation of the Tampak Area where the new public market was constructed.

Mr. Hans Bucalon said that the original name of the street that was in issue was Nickel Street, not Raymundo Azarcon St. He stressed that Nickel St. has no historical significance.

SB Member Romeo Emmanuel Azarcon expressed that although Levi M. Azarcon was politico, he has a big contribution to the development of the town.

Ms. Emma Hotchkiss said that during the previous meetings there were a number of streets that are yet to be given names. The recommendation, based on the guidelines, is that the streets be named in favor of those founders and emphasized that Azarcon was not a founder.

SB Member Romeo Emmanuel Azarcon insisted that the Azarcon St. be retained and not substituted making his basis the contributions of former mayor Levi M. Azarcon although he was not one of the founders of Cantilan.

Mr. Hans Bucalon explained that Mr. Raymundo Azarcon was a Cabeza but not a founder. He stressed that it will be a violation of law when the street names be changed within 10 years of its naming.

Barangay Captain Edel S. Bendoy asked if it is possible to name a street in favor of a donor of a certain parcel of land that was made one of the major streets in a barangay.

Mr. Bucalon answered in the affirmative but said it is discouraged under the NHCP rules.

On the other note, SB Member Genito B. Guardo suggested that the street names be engraved in a reflectorized material.

SB Member Romeo Emmanuel Azarcon said that there is a P500,000.00 allocation for street renaming.

SB Member Marlo B. Arreza discussed about the breakdown of the budget. He was supportive of the suggestion of Hon. Guardo to have the signages being reflectorized. Thereafter, he acknowledged the efforts of the resource persons who are also part of the technical working group for their efforts. He also thanked the attendees for the productive discussion on his proposed ordinance on street renaming.

Vice Mayor Liberty G. Cale, without wasting time, gave the floor to the next proponent Hon. Jimbo A. Luarez to discuss about his proposed ordinances.

2. ORDINANCE PROMOTING THE VOLUNTARY ADOPTION OF A DOUBLE LOCK SYSTEM FOR MOTORCYCLES IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF CANTILAN AS A PREVENTIVE MEASURE AGAINST THEFT IN THIS MUNICIPALITY.

Hon. Jimbo A. Luarez discussed about the proposed ordinance. He explained the importance in approving the said ordinance. He made his presentation discussing per section of the ordinance.

SB Member Charles P. Arreza commented that in the proposed ordinance, the motorcycle owners should not be penalized. Instead, the PNP shall be encouraged to work on this matter and perform their task in promoting peace and security in the locality. He also gave emphasis on the importance of installing cctv's at key areas within the town and also requiring some establishments to install the same as requirement for their business opening.

Ms. Emma Hotchkiss asked about the benefits of the said ordinance.

Hon. Jimbo A. Luarez said that it was the request of the PNP to the Sangguniang Bayan that this Ordinance be given preferential attention. He said that on the section about penalties, it can be adjusted but it won't mean that the whole ordinance will not be approved.

Barangay Captain Nicolas Maligsa said that the barangay officials shall not be the frontliners in the implementation of the said ordinance should it be approved. The PNP shall be the one who will implement the same with the barangay officials as supporters.

Barangay Captain Armando Arizobal expressed that the penalty to the owners shall be removed in the ordinance. It is at the owner's risk if they will not abide by the ordinance.

SB Member Romeo Emmanuel Azarcon explained that this ordinance was being studied thoroughly and the main point is safeguarding the loss of property.

Barangay Captain Ronnel Cuaton shared his sentiment stating that once the ordinance is approved this will be an additional burden to the traffic enforcers and the PNP. He pointed that the problem with "bora-bora" is not yet solved, hence, the addition of new ordinance will be added baggage.

Hon. Jimbo A. Luarez finally agreed that the penalty provision will be removed from the proposed ordinance.

The Chairperson concluded the public hearing by thanking all participants for their attendance in the discussing two proposed ordinance for the benefit of the constituents.

3. AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 8 OF ORDINANCE NO.12-1993, IMPOSING PENALTIES ON PERSONS APPREHENDED FOR THE POSSESSIONS OF DEADLY WEAPONS.

Hon. Jimbo A. Luarez explained that the proposed measure seeks to strengthen the existing ordinance by revisiting and updating the penalty provisions under Section 8 to ensure that they remain responsive to the present peace and order concerns of this municipality.

As times change, it becomes necessary for the local policies to adapt in order to effectively address emerging challenges related to public safety. The amendment is intended to reinforce the municipality's commitment to maintaining peace, protecting the constituents, and discouraging the unlawful possession of deadly weapons within the community. Thereafter, he proceeded his presentation by sections.

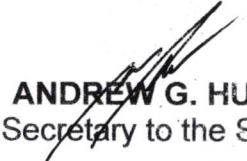
With no more clarifications from the audience, Hon. Jimbo A. Luarez moved to calendar his proposed ordinances to the plenary for further deliberation.

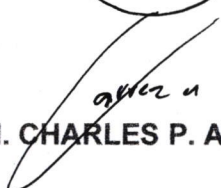

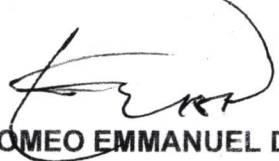
