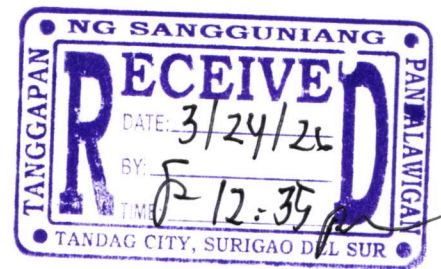

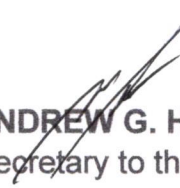

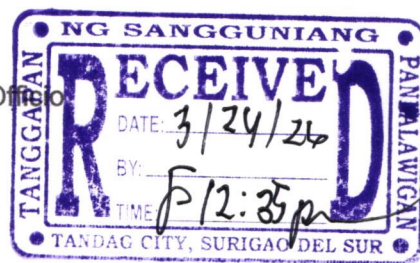

ORDINANCE NO. 3 – 2026

“AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 4-2010, MANDATING THE ORANGE COLOR-CODING AND THE STANDARDIZED ASSIGNMENT AND INSTALLATION OF OFFICIAL UNIT NUMBERS ON ALL REGISTERED PUBLIC UTILITY TRICYCLES AND PEDICABS OPERATING WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF CANTILAN, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE:

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 4-2010 was passed to govern the operation of public utility tricycles and in the Municipality of Cantilan, with the objective of ensuring public safety, maintaining order, and improving the delivery of transport services:

WHEREAS, it is necessary to strengthen the implementation of the said ordinance through the mandatory use of a **uniform orange color-coding scheme** and **standardized official unit numbers** for the proper identification of registered public utility tricycles and pedicabs;

WHEREAS, all registered public utility tricycles and pedicabs shall be **painted orange only**, to ensure consistency, easy recognition, and effective monitoring by authorities;

WHEREAS, the implementation of standardized color-coding and visible unit numbering will promote efficient identification of duly authorized units, enhance traffic regulation efforts, and facilitate effective enforcement of existing transport laws;

WHEREAS, standardizing the identification of public utility tricycles and pedicabs will prevent unauthorized operations and encourage responsibility among drivers and operators;

WHEREAS, adopting these measures is vital to protect the safety and welfare of the riding public and to maintain proper order in Cantilan's local transport system;

WHEREAS, to promote consistency and visibility, each registered public utility tricycle shall display its **official unit number on all sides**, in a standardized size of **eight inches (8")**, ensuring it can be easily seen by commuters and monitoring authorities alike;

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Sangguniang Bayan of the Municipality of Cantilan, Province of Surigao del Sur, that:

SECTION 1. Title. This Ordinance shall be known as the **"Orange Color-Coding and Standardized Unit Numbering Ordinance for Public Utility Tricycles and Pedicabs in the Municipality of Cantilan."**

SECTION 2. Coverage. This Ordinance shall apply to **all registered public utility tricycles** operating within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality of Cantilan.

SECTION 3. Mandatory Color-Coding. All registered public utility tricycles shall be **painted orange only**. No other base or dominant color shall be permitted, except for markings authorized by the Municipal Government.

SECTION 4. Official Unit Number

1. Each registered public utility tricycle shall display its **official unit number on all sides** of the vehicle.
2. The **size of the official unit number** shall be **eight inches (8")** for clear visibility.
3. Unit numbers shall be displayed in a manner that ensures they are **legible from a distance** and easily identifiable by commuters and monitoring authorities.

SECTION 5. Implementation. – The implementation of this Ordinance shall be vested in the Office of the Municipal Mayor through the Municipal Traffic Enforcement Unit, in coordination with the Cantilan Drivers and Operators Association (CDOA), and the Municipal Treasurer's Office. These offices shall oversee and ensure the proper enforcement of this Ordinance, including the conduct of regular inspections, monitoring of compliance, and the adoption of necessary measures to effectively carry out its provisions.

SECTION 6. Penalties for Violations. Any driver or operator found violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be subject to the following penalties:

1. **First Offense: P500.00**
2. **Second Offense: P1000.00**
3. **Third Offense: P1,500.00 or cancellation of MTOP.**

SECTION 7. Separability Clause. If any provision of this Ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration shall not affect the other provisions hereof which shall remain in full force and effect.

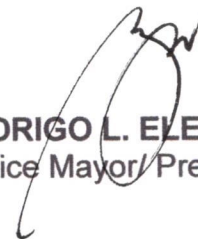
SECTION 8. Effectivity. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon approval and publication according to law.

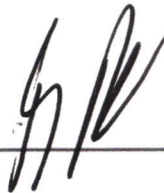

Moreover, he emphasized that students and senior citizens shall be entitled to a 20% fare discount in accordance with existing laws.

Mr. Ruben Liwagon suggested adherence to the guidelines of the Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB), proposing that fare rates be determined based on distance per kilometer through mutual agreement between the Council and the tricycle operators. He also recommended the issuance of franchises to regulate the number of authorized operators. He further noted that the limited number of passengers contributes significantly to the increase in fare rates.

The Chair agreed with Mr. Liwagon and reiterated his proposal, stating that an additional fare of P2.00 shall be charged beyond five hundred (500) meters, and an additional P4.00 shall be imposed for every succeeding kilometer.

A CDOA driver stated that one (1) liter of fuel is consumed for every twenty-five (25) kilometers traveled.

In response, the Chair explained that fuel consumption varies depending on the type and condition of the motorcycle used. He proposed conducting a trial-and error test at his own expense to accurately determine gasoline consumption. Passengers shall be hired for the purpose of assessing actual fuel usage.

A CDOA driver further proposed the inclusion of the Parang to Cabangahan route, noting that that "Bao-Bao" drivers have been operating along the route for more than two (2) years without securing the necessary business permits and have been charging a fare of P70.00 per one-way trip.

SBM John Elven Vega stated that in previous years, the fare for the said route was P200.00 due to poor road conditions.

After deliberation, the Chair proposed a fare of P60.00, which was unanimously approved by the Body.

ASSIGNMENT OF TRICYCLE NUMBERS

The Chair proposed to place the number in front, side and inside the tricycles.

COLOR-CODING SCHEMES FOR TRICYCLES

The Chair introduced Ordinance No. 1 – 2005 and read the color scheme assignment of the following:

1. MAGOSILOM	RED
2. PAG-ANTAYAN	ORANGE

The Chair proposed the color orange as the official color for tricycle units, which was unanimously approved by the operators.

A "Bao-Bao" driver stated that some units are not yet fully paid; thus, the proposed retaining the original body and changing only the ceiling color of the units.

The Chair agreed to the proposal, on the condition that the body color of the units shall be changed to orange upon full payment.

A CDOA driver suggested that the "Bao-Bao" units should likewise be assigned identification numbers.

ILLEGAL PARKING CONCERNS

The Chair reminded the operators regarding the proper use of headlights. He further stated that, given the current situation at the Barangay Pag-antayan Triangle, the are should be utilized for passenger pick-up only. He also reiterated the proposal of SBM Genito Guardo.

SBM Genito Guardo inquired whether the operators agreed with his proposal to convert the Barangay Pag-antayan Triangle into a circular traffic scheme. The operators unanimously expressed their agreement.

Mr. Warlito Cale emphasized that the presence of a police officer at the Barangay Pag-antayan Triangle is vital to prevent illegal parking.

PLT Emmanuel Ellazo stated that they are currently experiencing a shortage of personnel and have already requested additional manpower. He explained that, due to this limitation, personnel cannot remain on standby and are required to conduct continuous patrols around Cantilan. He further clarified that they do not have citation tickets but only the traffic enforcers, with whom they coordinate regarding enforcement.

A driver raised a concern regarding TGP operators who secured business permits in the Municipality of Carrascal but are operating within the Municipality of Cantilan.

The ABC President remarked that he was already aware of the issue and suggested the modification and proper registration of all operators. He further emphasized the importance of having a Board of Directors, noting that there are currently slightly over 300 registered operators, compared to more than 600 in previous years.

The Chair stated that there should be only one recognized organization, the Cantilan Drivers and Operators Associaion (CDOA), and that all other organizations should operate under the CDOA.

A driver stated that they have been members of the CDOA for several years. He further recommended that the "dakop" operation be conducted for the entire day instead of being limited to one hour.

establishment have secured the necessary permission regarding their parking arrangements.

The Chair noted that the issue has been a long-standing concern. He referred the matter to the Traffic In-Charge, Mr. Atong, and suggested the deployment of additional traffic enforcers. He also recommended the installation of a CCTV in the area.

PLT Emmanuel Cosmiano stated that most of the driver are students without valid driver's licenses. He added apprehensions could be made if citation tickets are made available to them.

ABC President suggested taking photographs as supporting evidence during enforcement operations.

REGULATION AND CONTROL OF "BORA-BORA" MOTORS

The Chair proposed granting a reward amounting to P500.00, at his own expense, to members of the PNP and Traffic Enforcers who successfully apprehend operators of Bora-Bora Motors and tricycles that have not secured membership with the CDOA.

SBM Genito Guardo stated that all proposals and suggestions will be thoroughly discussed during the regular session in aid of legislation. He further emphasized that operators who are not members of the CDOA shall not be allowed to secure a business permit.

A CDOA driver recommended the conduct of a seminar for tricycle operators to promote road safety and help prevent accidents.

The Chair stated that a one-day seminar will also be conducted as part of the enhancement program.

The Body agreed to conduct a dry run this coming Thursday, with Mr. Warlito Cale's residence designated as the meeting venue at 9:00 a.m.

ADJOURNMENT

With no more concerns raised, the meeting was adjourned at 4:25 p.m. on the same day. SBM Genito Guardo moved for the adjournment, duly seconded by SBM Lorna G. Almeda.

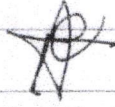
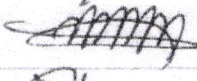
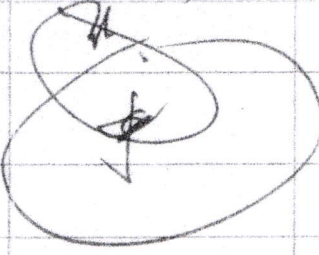
