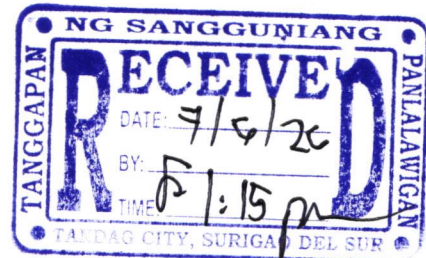

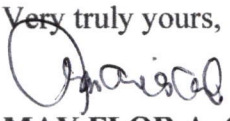

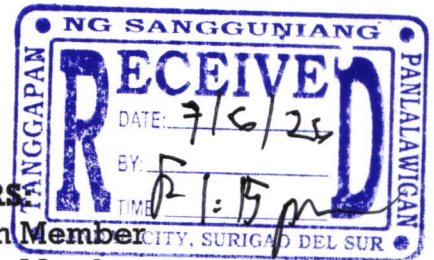
**“AN ORDINANCE DECLARING CERTAIN PROGRAMS, PROJECTS, AND
ACTIVITIES (PPAs) UNDER THE FIVE PERCENT (5%) MUNICIPAL DISASTER
RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT FUND OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF
BAROBO ABANDONED AND DECLARING THE FUNDS APPERTAINING
THERETO AVAILABLE FOR REPROGRAMMING, SUBJECT TO EXISTING
LAWS, RULES, AND REGULATIONS”**

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WHEREAS, Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, empowers local government units to exercise powers necessary and appropriate for effective governance and the promotion of the general welfare;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 10121, otherwise known as the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010, mandates local government units to establish and utilize their Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund in accordance with applicable laws, policies, plans, and guidelines on disaster risk reduction and management;

WHEREAS, the utilization and administration of the Five Percent (5%) Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund shall be in accordance with existing budgeting, accounting, auditing, and disaster risk reduction and management laws, rules, and regulations;

WHEREAS, the Commission on Audit (COA), through its audit findings and observations, noted the necessity of formally abandoning certain Programs, Projects, and Activities (PPAs) prior to any realignment or reprogramming thereof;

WHEREAS, in compliance with the aforesaid audit findings and applicable regulations, the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (MDRRMC) passed **MDRRMC Resolution No. 01** entitled: **“Resolution Approving and Endorsing to the Municipal Development Council (MDC) the Abandonment of Certain Programs, Projects, and Activities (PPAs) under the Five Percent (5%) MDRRM Fund Amounting to ₱6,267,871.96 of Barobo”**;

WHEREAS, thereafter, the **Municipal Development Council (MDC)**, through **MDC Resolution No. 05, Series of 2026**, approved and endorsed the aforesaid **MDRRMC Resolution** to the Sangguniang Bayan for appropriate legislative action;

WHEREAS, upon review and evaluation by the MDRRM Council and the MDC, certain PPAs under the Five Percent (5%) MDRRM Fund were found to be no longer feasible, necessary, practical, or responsive to the current priorities and needs of the Municipality due to changes in circumstances, implementation constraints, duplication of appropriations, availability of alternative funding sources, and shifting development priorities;

WHEREAS, the abandonment of said PPAs is necessary to ensure the efficient and judicious utilization of disaster risk reduction and management resources and to enable the reallocation of funds to more urgent and priority disaster preparedness, mitigation, response, rehabilitation, and recovery interventions;

WHEREAS, after due deliberation, the Sangguniang Bayan found merit in approving and adopting MDC Resolution No. 05, Series of 2026 in order to comply with audit requirements and uphold transparency, accountability, and sound fiscal management in the utilization of the MDRRM Fund.

NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Sangguniang Bayan of Barobo, Surigao del Sur, in session, **THAT:**

SECTION 1. Title. This Ordinance shall be known as the **“Ordinance Adopting the Abandonment of Certain Programs, Projects, and Activities Under the Five Percent (5%) Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund of the Municipality of Barobo.”**

SECTION 2. Declaration of Abandonment. The Programs, Projects, and Activities (PPAs) identified by the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council through MDRRMC Resolution No. 01 and endorsed by the Municipal Development Council through MDC Resolution No. 05, Series of 2026, and enumerated in Section 3 hereof, are hereby declared **ABANDONED**.

SECTION 3. Abandonment of Programs, Projects, and Activities. The following Programs, Projects, and Activities (PPAs) are hereby declared **ABANDONED**:

SECTION 4. Justification for the Abandonment of PPAs. Below are the respective justifications for the abandonment of the subject Programs, Projects, and Activities (PPAs) under the 5% MDRRM Fund of this Local Government Unit:

Justification for Abandonment:

Name of PPAs	Justification for Abandonment
Welfare Good Expenses - Supplemental Budget No. 1	This fund is part of the surplus coming from the local revenue determined only after the budget approval and affirmation. And so, with no specific projects identified and approved yet.

Other structure- rep & maint of Bldg & other structure (OPCEN)	This has been unused in the previous year. And another fund for CY 2026 was allocated making the former funding unnecessary.
Procurement of 1 unit Response Vehicle	With the increasing prices of almost all goods and products, the funding intended for
Conduct of Trainings (ICSIP, BFA, SAR, etc.)	Additional funding necessary to implement these many trainings.
Conduct of Planning Workshop (CRA, CBDRMP, LDRRM Plan, etc.)	Additional funding necessary to complete these many plans, especially that the contingency plan for flooding and storm surge needs to be updated and crafted.
Purchase of 8 units fire hose	The Barobo Fire station has informed that additional fire hoses have already been given by their national counterpart.
Purchase of 1-unit Portable Speaker with microphone	There are still available speakers from other offices that the office can use during activities. Funds intended for speakers may be added to more pressing concerns.
Procurement and Installation of Evacuation Facility Signages	The existing evacuation center in the municipality needs to be rehabilitated first before it can be operational. Thus, installation of signages would be useless.
Procurement of other Supplies and materials for operation (reflectorized vest, carabiner, rope, spine board, life vest, hardhats with flashlights etc.)	Upon careful review of the inventory of the Operations Center, there is still just enough materials to continue service delivery and funds intended for additional supplies, may be added to more pressing concerns.
Surveying Expenses for Application for Subdivision Plan and Permit	Since CY 2020 Funds will be reverted to general funds, it can be used for the same purpose and with higher allocation to include land development.
Renewal of Vehicle Registration and Radio Registration	Funds for the same purpose have already been allocated for CY 2026 as it is an annual appropriation. And so, funds intended for the same purpose may be added to more pressing concerns.

SECTION 5. Availability of Funds for Reprogramming. Upon abandonment of the foregoing PPAs, the total amount of ₱6,267,871.96 previously appropriated thereto is hereby declared available for reallocation, reprogramming, or re-identification to other priority disaster risk reduction and management programs, projects, and activities, subject to existing budgeting, accounting, procurement, auditing, and disaster risk reduction and management laws, rules, and regulations.

SECTION 6. Compliance with Audit and MDRRM Regulations. All reprogramming and subsequent utilization of funds made available under this Ordinance shall strictly comply with Republic Act No. 10121, Republic Act No. 7160, applicable COA Circulars, DBM-DILG-NDRRMC Joint Memorandum Circulars, and other pertinent laws, rules, and regulations.

SECTION 7. Implementing Offices. The Municipal Mayor, through the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (MDRRMO), Municipal Planning and Development Coordinator, Municipal Budget Officer, Municipal Accountant, and Municipal Treasurer, shall ensure the proper implementation of this Ordinance.

SECTION 8. Separability Clause. If any provision of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the remaining provisions not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 9. Repealing Clause. All ordinances, resolutions, executive issuances, rules, and regulations inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.

SECTION 10. Effectivity. This Ordinance shall take effect upon approval and after compliance with the posting and publication requirements prescribed by law.

RESOLUTION NO. 05

Series of 2026

“RESOLUTION APPROVING AND ENDORSING TO THE SANGGUNIAN THE MDRRMC RESOLUTION NO. 01 ENTITLED “RESOLUTION APPROVING AND ENDORSING TO THE MUNICIPAL DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL (MDC) THE ABANDONMENT OF CERTAIN PROGRAMS, PROJECTS, AND ACTIVITIES UNDER THE 5% MUNICIPAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT FUND AMOUNTING TO SIX MILLION, TWO HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN THOUSAND, EIGHT HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE PESOS AND 96/100 (6,267,871.96) OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF BAROBO, SURIGAO DEL SUR”

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 21 of Republic Act No. 10121, also known as the "Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010," a minimum of 5% of estimated regular revenue must be set aside for disaster risk management to cover preparedness, relief, and rehabilitation, with 30% designated as a Quick Response Fund (QRF). This fund shall be decided by the MDRRMC;

WHEREAS, Section 107 of RA 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code (LGC) of 1991 provides for the composition of a multi-sectoral body known as the Local Development Council (LDC) which is tasked to assist the Sangguniang Bayan in setting the direction of the economic and social development and coordinates the development efforts of the municipality;



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WHEREAS, Section 106 of Republic Act No. 7160 provides that local development councils shall assist the Sanggunian in setting the direction of economic and social development, and in coordinating development efforts within their territorial jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, Section 114 of Republic Act No. 7160 authorizes the Local Development Council to formulate and recommend local development investment programs, which serve as the basis for budgetary allocations;

WHEREAS, Section 318 of Republic Act No. 7160 provides that funds and appropriations may be realigned or modified when public interest so requires, subject to applicable laws, rules, and regulations;

WHEREAS, Section 322 of Republic Act No. 7160 provides that unexpended balances of appropriations authorized in the annual appropriations ordinance shall revert to the unappropriated surplus of the general fund at the end of the fiscal year and shall not thereafter be available for the expenditure except by subsequent enactment. Moreover, for capital outlays shall continue and remain valid until fully spent, reverted or the project is completed;

WHEREAS, Section 322 of Republic Act No. 7160 also provides that the balances of continuing appropriations shall be reviewed as part of the annual budget preparation and the Sanggunian concerned may approve, upon recommendation of the local chief executive, the reversion of funds no longer needed in connection with the activities funded by said continuing appropriations;

WHEREAS, the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (MDRRMC) conducted their quarterly meeting last April 6, 2026 and endorsed to the MDC Resolution No. 01 entitled "Resolution Approving and Endorsing to the Municipal Development Council (MDC) the Abandonment of Certain Programs, Projects, And Activities Under The 5% Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction And Management Fund Amounting To Six Million, Two Hundred Sixty-Seven Thousand, Eight Hundred Seventy-One Pesos And 96/100 (6,267,871.96) Of The Municipality Of Barobo, Surigao Del Sur";

WHEREAS, the Municipal Development Council (MDC) of the Local Government Unit of Barobo, Surigao del Sur conducted their First Semestral Meeting last April 8, 2026, at the Kvenz Restobar, Purok 2, Poblacion, Barobo, Surigao del Sur to discuss matters relative to their task as special body of the Local Government Unit (LGU);

WHEREAS, upon review and evaluation of the MDRRMC as submitted to MDC, certain PPAs under the 5% LDRRMF have been determined to be no longer feasible, necessary, or responsive to the current priorities and needs of the Municipality due to various factors such as

Procurement of other Supplies and materials for operation (reflectorized vest, carabiner, rope, spine board, life vest, hardhats with flashlights etc.)	Upon careful review of the inventory of the Operations Center, there is still just enough materials to continue service delivery and funds intended for additional supplies, may be added to more pressing concerns.
Surveying Expenses for Application for Subdivision Plan and Permit	Since CY 2020 Funds will be reverted to general funds, it can be used for the same purpose and with higher allocation to include land development.
Renewal of Vehicle Registration and Radio Registration	Funds for the same purpose have already been allocated for CY 2026 as it is an annual appropriation. And so, funds intended for the same purpose may be added to more pressing concerns.

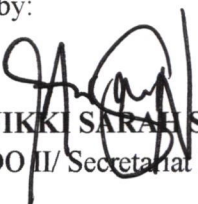

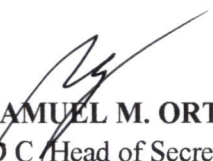
