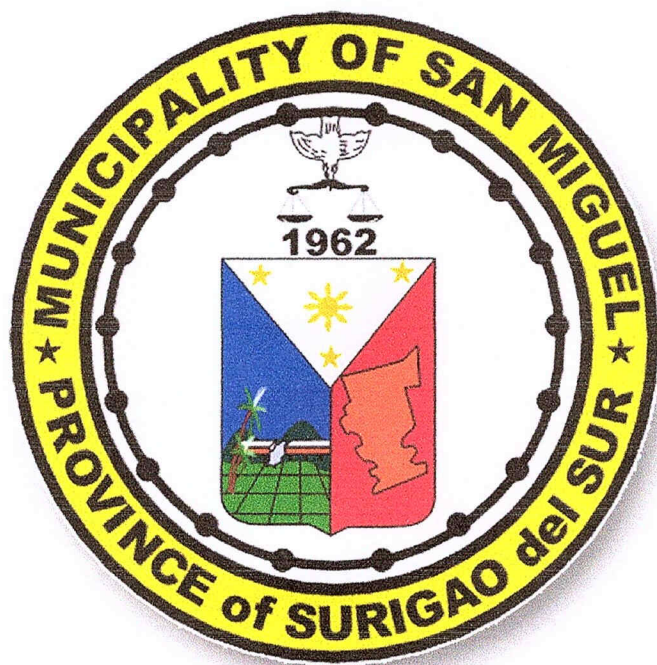

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 30, SERIES OF 2024, ENTITLED: AN ORDINANCE
PRESCRIBING THE STANDARD RATES OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO INDIVIDUALS IN CRISIS SITUATION
(AICS) AND EMERGENCY SHELTER ASSISTANCE (ESA), AND SETTING GUIDELINES FOR GIVING THE
SAME, BY ESTABLISHING REVISED GUIDELINES AND PROCEDURES FOR THE GRANT AND
ADMINISTRATION THEREOF,

Explanatory Note

WHEREAS, the Municipal Government of San Miguel recognizes the need to provide timely,
responsive, and equitable assistance to individuals and families experiencing crisis situations,
calamities, emergencies, and other circumstances requiring immediate intervention;

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 30, Series of 2024 was enacted to establish standard rates and
guidelines for the provision of Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situations (AICS) and Emergency
Shelter Assistance (ESA);

WHEREAS, there is a need to revisit and strengthen the existing guidelines and procedures to ensure transparency, accountability, efficiency, and responsiveness in the implementation of the said assistance programs;

WHEREAS, the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) has recommended the revision of certain provisions of Ordinance No. 30, Series of 2024 to better address the current needs of beneficiaries and align with existing national policies and regulations;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Sangguniang Bayan of San Miguel, Surigao del Sur, in session assembled that:

Section 1. Title. This ordinance shall be known as cited as “Financial Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation.”

Section 2. Definition of Terms:

- a. **Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation (AICS).** Financial to individuals or families whose normal functioning has been hampered due to difficult situations brought about by dysfunctional situations that may be caused by poor health conditions, natural and man-made calamities and other situations.
- b. **Earthquake.** A sudden and violent shaking of the ground, sometimes causing great destruction because of movements within the earth’s crust or volcanic action.
- c. **Emergency Shelter Assistance (ESA).** Financial assistance to augment resources of affected families who opted not to be transferred to a resettlement site to enable them to purchase materials for their damaged houses. It is also known as “Self-build” shelter assistance.
- d. **Erosion.** The process by which the surface of the earth gets worn down or removes soil and rock from one location on the earth’s crust, then transports it to another location where it is deposited.
- e. **Fire.** A state, process, or instance of combustion in which fuel or other material is ignited and combined with oxygen, giving off light, heat, and flame.
- f. **Landslide.** A geological phenomenon that includes a wide range of ground movements, such as rock falls, deep failure of slopes, and shallow debris flows. Landslide can occur in offshore, coastal, and onshore environments.
- g. **Typhoon.** A tropical cyclone with a maximum wind of 34 knots or higher. Typhoons feature heavy rains and winds that maintain speed equal to or greater than 74 miles (119 km) per hour.

This AICS program can be availed by the constituents of legal age whose cases fall under Section 2, registered voters and residents of San Miguel, Surigao del Sue, and either parent/guardians are registered voters/residents of San Miguel, Surigao del Sur if the client is under are.

Section 4. Repealing Clause. Any other ordinances, resolutions, and policies of the Municipal Government contrary or inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby deemed repealed.

Section 5. Separability Clause. Should any part of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by proper authority, the other parts or provisions hereof which are not affected shall continue to be in full force and effect.

Section 6. Effectivity. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.

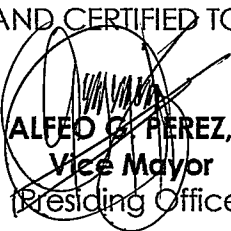
