RABIES CONTROL ORDINANCE OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF CORTES, SURIGAO DEL SUR

Introduced by: **HON. MERCEDETTE V. DUMAGAN, MPA**
Seconded by: **All Members Present**

WHEREAS, it is of public knowledge that there are dogs roaming the streets, public parks, beach resorts, and in other public places which are not vaccinated against rabies

WHEREAS, aside from being potential carriers of zoonotic diseases, stray dogs are also one of the major causes of vehicular accidents

WHEREAS, the vaccination cost of human anti-rabies medicine to the bite victims is very expensive that even the middle income persons can hardly afford to pay for medicine.

WHEREAS, the incidence of dog and animal bites are due to failure of pet owners to follow the standard on responsible pet ownership as defined in section 5 of RA 9482 The Anti-Rabies Act and section 6 of RA 8485 The Animal Welfare Act.

WHEREAS, in order to protect the lives of the general public from being inflicted of rabies from dog and other animal bites, it is imperative to adopt rabies control measures in the Municipality of Cortes.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF THIS MUNICIPALITY that:

Article I. Title and Definition of Terms

Section 1. Title. This ordinance shall be known and referred to as the Rabies Control Ordinance of Municipality of Cortes.

Section 2. Definition of Terms:

- a. **Authorized Animal Catchers** – trained personnel designated by the Municipal Rabies Control Council-Technical Working Group (TWG-MRCC) as the only one authorized to capture stray, unregistered, unvaccinated, and pets whose owners registration/license has been revoked.
- b. **Bitten-** refers to an act by which a dog seizes, cuts or grips with its teeth so that the skin of a person gets wounded, pierced or scratched
- c. **Breeder-** persons involved animal propagation
- d. **Concerned Officials-** refers to barangay officials, health workers, police officers or government veterinarian
- e. **Direct Supervision-** refers to range of supervision where physical presence of the veterinarian within the barangay is necessary during vaccination
- f. **Dog-** refers to a common quadruped domestic animal belonging to the order carnivore male/ female, scientifically known as *Canis familiaris*
- g. **Enclosed Premises-** means the owner's house or fenced yard where other people have no reason to enter except to conduct business or visit with the member of the household
- h. **Euthanasia-** refers to the process of painless death to animals
- i. **Impound-** refers to seize and hold in the custody of the law
- j. **Licked on open wound-** means contacted by virus laden saliva through uncovered or broken skin
- k. **Nuisance** – a pet causing inconvenience, annoyance, harm or injury.
- l. **Owner** - refers to any person keeping, harboring or having charge, care or control of a dog including his/her representative, shall mean any person keeping harboring or having charge or permitting any dog to habitually be or remain on or be lodged or fed in such a persons house, yard or premises, establishment e.g. pet shop
- m. **Pet** -refers to dog, cat, other animals known to be rabies prone animals and are able to transfer the virus to humans
- n. **Pound** -refers to a public enclosure for stray animals
- o. **Public place** - refers to any place open to the public like parks mall markets streets
- p. **Post Exposure Treatment/ PET** -Refers to rabies vaccination administered after an exposure to rabies which includes local wound care, rabies vaccine with or without anti-rabies immunizing agent.
- q. **Pre Exposure Prophylaxis/ PEP** -Refers to rabies vaccination administered before an exposure to rabies to those who are at high risk of getting rabies

- c. Duties and functions-
- Review and approve proposals or policies related to rabies control
 - Review and approve budget proposal for rabies control
 - Review and approve amendments, policies, activities suggested by the MRCC-Technical Working Group (TWG)
 - Hold meetings quarterly or as needed

Section 4. Municipal Rabies Control Council-Technical Working Group/ MRCC-TWG

- For the purpose of this section, a technical working group (TWG) shall be created by the Municipal Mayor through an executive order.
- duties and functions:
 - Oversight body that will lead, recommend and assist in the formulation of activities, policies, implementing rules and regulations, budget and guidelines on all matters pertaining to rabies prevention and control measures
 - Recommend amendments or revisions of any provision of this ordinance
 - Evaluate or investigate animal bite cases

Section 5. Barangay Rabies Control Desk Officer and Enforcers

- Through a barangay council ordinance, a Barangay Rabies Control Desk shall be created. This shall be manned by a Barangay Rabies Control Officer (BARCO) which shall be recommended by the concerned Barangay Council and deputized by the local chief executive. The barangay may recommend a minimum of one enforcer per purok which is also recommended by the concerned Barangay Council and deputized by the local chief executive.
- Duties and function:
 - Lead in implementing activities for barangays approved by the MRCC
 - Recommend activities to be funded by the special account generated from pet registration and penalties from barangay impounding

Article III. Mandatory Duties and Obligations

Section 6. Compulsory Pet Registration

- a. All pets, regardless of breed and age, shall be registered by the owner with their respective barangay and shall pay the registration fee. Thereat such registration shall be renewed yearly, specifically every January.

This registration will also serve as license to possess a pet and may be revoked if found that the pet owner is unable to follow responsibilities as indicated in this ordinance and was proven to be a nuisance in the community. If the owner is a minor, he shall so declare in his application for registration provided that he shall be represented by his parents or guardians who shall be liable in case of violation of any provision of this ordinance.

- b. Pet shops and all other entities which sell pets shall register all their animals at the Municipal Agriculture Office. Otherwise, unregistered pet sold and/or found thereat shall be subject to confiscation and impoundment, and the business permit of the pet shops and other entities to cancellation and subsequent closure of the said establishment.
- c. Veterinary Clinics, Pet shops and similar establishments shall apply for BAI animal facility registration.
- d. Breeders or those pet owners opting to keep their male pets intact shall register at the Municipal Agriculture Office. The MAO with the assistance of the Provincial Veterinary Office will issue guidelines on breeding operations.
- e. The barangay shall maintain a list of registered pets in their barangay. Upon registration, the barangay shall issue a registration card which shall contain the following information:

BARANGAY, PUROK, NAME OF PET OWNER, NAMES OF PET/S OWNED, SPECIES, SEX, REPRODUCTIVE STATUS, EST. DATE OF GIVING BIRTH, AGE, WEIGHT, DISTINGUISHING MARKS/ COLOR, BREED, CARD NUMBER, ISSUING OFFICER, DATE OF ISSUE

- f. The registration card is formatted to serve also as vaccination and health certificate upon signature of authorized personnel. It shall contain additional pages for use in the annual vaccination and checkup.
- g. The card shall be presented by the owner to a licensed veterinarian or other persons in authority during vaccination and health examination of the pet and for other purposes that so requires.

Section 7. Compulsory Vaccination

- a. All pets, upon reaching 3 months of age shall be vaccinated by a licensed veterinarian or a trained technician upon presentation of the registration card. Strictly, **NO REGISTRATION, NO VACCINATION**. This shall be repeated yearly until Municipality of Cortes is declared by certifying agency as rabies-free without vaccination.
- b. Private veterinarians and other government veterinary offices shall also require the registration card before vaccination. These establishments or agencies shall be required to submit a summary of vaccinated pets monthly to the Office of the Municipal Agriculturist (MAO) and shall include, but not limited to the following information:

BARANGAY, PUROK, OWNER'S NAME, PETS NAME, SPECIES, SEX, AGE, COLOR/
DISTINGUISHING MARKS, DATE OF REGISTRATION AND REGISTRATION CARD
NUMBER, DATE OF VACCINATION, VACCINE USED, LOT NUMBER, EXPIRY, NAME
OF VETERINARIAN AND LICENSE NUMBER

- c. The vaccination form attached in the registration card shall be filled up after vaccination and shall be kept by the pet owner to be presented yearly during vaccination for updating. The vaccination form shall contain the following information:

DATE OF VACCINATION, VACCINE USED, LOT NUMBER, EXPIRATION,
NAME OF VETERINARIAN/TRAINED TECHNICIAN, LICENSE NUMBER
AND SIGNATURE

Section 8. Pet Identification

A system of pet identification (pet tag) shall be formulated and implemented by the TWG-MRCC. This shall provide information or positive identification of the registered pet and its owner, provided that the same shall be worn at all times.

Section 9. Control over pets in Public Place

Pet owners shall maintain control over pets and not allow it to roam the streets or any public place without a leash.

Section 10. Mandatory Castration

All male **dogs/ cats** shall be castrated one (1) month after registration except those classified and registered as breeder animals.

Section 11. Mandatory signage at gate/entrance

All **dog** owners are mandated to put a signage at the gate or entrance of their household. It shall contain the message "Beware of Dog", registration number and other information.

Section 12. Responsibility of Pet Owners:

- a. Submit pets for mandatory registration and yearly renewal
- b. Must have their pets regularly vaccinated against rabies at 3 months of age and yearly thereafter. Must provide collar/s for identification.
- c. Maintain all records of registration and vaccination conducted for accurate record purposes
- d. Maintain control over their pet and do not allow it to roam the streets or any public places without supervision of owner and must be leashed. Must post in their gate the Mandatory Signage
- e. Provide pet with proper grooming, adequate food and clean shelter
- f. Within twenty-four (24) hours report immediately any animal biting incident to authorities for investigation and appropriate action and place such animal under observation by a government or private veterinarian
- g. Manage the biting pet by restraining it using a leash or confine in a cage. Subject the pet to a 14-day observation period supervised by a government veterinarian. The MRCC-TWG will formulate procedures in the Implementing Rules and Regulations of this ordinance. The pet must not be killed. If the pet dies immediately, contact a government veterinarian.

- h. Dog owner must immediately assist the human bite victim and shoulder the medical expenses incurred and other incidental expenses relative to the victim's injuries including laboratory fees for dog's brain examination.

Section 13. Reporting Protocol on incidence of dog bites

The owner of the dog which has bitten and the bite victim shall within 24 hours from the time of occurrence report the incidence to barangay officials or barangay rabies control officer and or police or deputized enforcers who after receiving such information shall immediately transmit the said information to the TWG-Municipal Rabies Control Council/ MAO for investigation and reporting.

Section 14. Liability of owners of biting pets

- a. The owner of the pet which has bitten another person shall immediately assist the human bite victim and shoulder the medical expenses incurred and other incidental expenses relative to the victim's injuries including dog examination.
- b. In case the bite was inflicted by a restrained registered pet and or had occurred within the dog owner's enclosed premises without the knowledge of the owner the liability shall be settled between the owner and the bite victim.

Section 15. Regulation of slaughtering and selling of dogs and eating of dog meat

Slaughtering, selling dogs for slaughter, and eating dog meat shall be strictly prohibited. In cases where killing cannot be avoided, the same shall be done in accordance with the conditions stipulated in the Animal Welfare Act of 1998- RA 8485.

Section 16. Regulation on eating of suspected rabies infected animal

No part of the body of a suspected rabid animal or animal bitten by a suspected rabid animal shall be eaten. The whole animal shall be disposed of properly supervised by authorized personnel by the MRCC-TWG.

Section 17. Regulation of "Tandok"

The LGU shall conduct IEC against resorting to services of "magtatandok" in order to stop illegal practice of administering false cure and giving of unfounded pieces of advice on bite victims. Should the bite victim die by reason of the treatment given by "Tandok", the latter shall be held liable to the fullest extent in accordance with existing laws:

Section 18. Regulation of disposal of suspected rabies infected cadaver by embalming establishments.

Embalming establishments shall strictly follow protocols in disposing of suspected rabies infected cadaver in accordance with the Sanitation Code of the Philippines.

Article IV. Fees and Penalties

Section 19. Impoundment and/or elimination of dogs

Any person who has violated sections 6,7,9,12,13 shall be subjected to:

First Offense

-the animal is impounded, with impounding fee of P1,000. In addition, the pet owner shall attend a seminar on Responsible Pet Ownership, have

	the pet vaccinated, castrated if male, registered and pay the corresponding fees thereof.
Second Offense	-the animal is impounded, upon claiming of the pet pay the impounding fee of P2,000
Third and Subsequent Offenses	-the animal is impounded, upon claiming of the pet pay the impounding fee of P2,500

Compliance shall be made within three (3) days from the date of impoundment. Otherwise, on the fourth (4th) day, the animal shall be posted through barangay bulletin board (where the pet is being capture) and be posted to an official social media platforms for adoption by qualified persons. On the fifth (5th) day, the impounded animal shall be euthanized in accordance with existing laws and humane standards.

Section 20. Fees.

- a. All pet owners shall pay the following to:
 - a.1. Registration fee and Barangay Impounding fee to the Barangay Treasurer
 - a.2. Vaccination fee and all other fees to the Municipal Treasurer
- b. Barangay fees shall be charged to special account to be used by the barangay to fund rabies control related activities such as but not limited to the establishment and maintenance of their own holding pen.
- c. Vaccination and registration fee shall be used by the municipal government CHARGED TO SPECIAL ACCOUNT to purchase anti-rabies vaccines for animals and registration/vaccination cards
- d. Other fees to be paid to the MTO:

i.	Home Service Vaccination Fee:	P 300.00/ request
ii.	Home Service Castration Fee:	P 1,000.00/ head
iii.	Lost Registration Card Fee:	P 150.00/ card
iv.	Municipal Pound Impounding Fee:	P 1,000.00/ head
v.	Barangay Impounding Fee:	P 500.00/ head
vi.	Health Certificate:	P 100.00/ head
vii.	Breeder Registration:	P 500.00/ head/ year
viii.	Barangay Pet Registration Fee:	P 50.00/ head/ year
ix.	Vaccination Fee:	P 50.00/ head
x.	Permit to Transport Certification Fee	P 100.00/head

Section 21. Penalties for violation of sections 8,10,11,14, 15, 16, 17, 18

Any person who has violated the provisions of this ordinance shall be subjected to:

First Offense	- a fine of 1,500
Second Offense and Subsequent Offenses	- a fine of P2,500 or 1-month imprisonment or both at the discretion of the court

Article V. Enforcement Mechanism

Section 22. Citation Ticket –

- a. A citation ticket shall be issued to violators of the provisions of this Ordinance. The citation ticket shall state, among others, the name and address of the violator, the specific violation committed and the corresponding administrative penalty;

- b. The Philippine National Police (PNP) and such other appropriate enforcers as commissioned by the Municipal Mayor through the Municipal Anti-Rabies Control Council shall have the power to apprehend violators of the Ordinance and issue citation tickets.
- c. The Municipal Mayor through the Municipal Anti-Rabies Control Council may deputize Barangay Officials or representatives of the private sector, non-government organizations and government organizations in the strict implementation of this Ordinance, as the need arises.

Section 23. NO CONTEST PROVISION

- a. Persons liable for violating sections 7,9,13 and 14(a) of this Ordinance who is apprehended or cited for violation and who does not wish to contest the violation and is willing to pay voluntarily the impounding fee imposed upon him/her shall be allowed to pay a penalty in the amount of Five Hundred Pesos (P500) with the Municipal Treasurer's Office within three (3) days from apprehension.
- b. The no contest provision can only be availed once. All proceeds from payment of the herein penalty imposed shall accrue to the Municipal General Funds;
- c. Notwithstanding the payment of the administrative penalty herein provided, the failure of any pet owner to undergo the responsible pet ownership seminar on the first offense pursuant to section 19 of this ordinance shall still warrant the continued impoundment of the subject animal

Section 24. Administrative Provisions

- a. A municipal pound shall be established and maintained as prescribed by the national rabies prevention and control committee and will be under the direct supervision and control of the Municipal Agriculture Office.

The site shall be designated by the municipal mayor. The MRCC-TWG will formulate procedures in the administration and maintenance of the facility and the conduct of impounding in the Implementing Rules and Regulations of this ordinance

- b. Stray, unregistered and unvaccinated dogs especially those that habituate public places and those no longer controlled by its owner or the registration/license to own has been revoked and any other violations to sections 7, 9, 13, 14 shall be impounded. Animal voluntarily surrendered may also be captured. Schedule of capture is unannounced.
- c. Each barangay may provide a holding pen approved by the TWG-MRCC/Municipal Agriculture Office and location designated by the barangay council.
- d. Pets caught by authorized animal catchers, with the assistance of barangay personnel, shall be temporarily impounded in the barangay holding pen for a period of **not less than twenty-four (24) hours** to allow announcement and claiming by the owner. **If not claimed within the 24-hour period, the animal shall be transferred to the municipal pound.**
- e. A municipal pound notice covering a period of 3 consecutive days will be issued upon admission of the seized animal. The notice containing the following information shall be posted on the barangay hall where the animal was captured

1. Image / picture, color, breed and other description of the animal;
2. Date, time, and place the animal was caught

3. Notice that unless redeemed the animal may be adopted or destroyed if circumstances do not allow otherwise
- f. All impounded pets must be registered, and vaccinated against rabies, male pets castrated and the fees charged to the owner before release.
 - g. Humane methods prescribed by the Animal Welfare Act (R.A. 8485) in the method of catching, transporting, housing and elimination of animals shall be followed by the pound.
 - h. The Municipal Agriculturist or authorized representative, rabies control authority and or police may enter any land area for seizing or destroying any pet that is to be seized according to this section.
 - i. The MRCC and MRCC-TWG shall promulgate rules and regulations with the approval of the Municipal Mayor as are necessary to ensure the full implementation of this ordinance. Enforcement shall be the responsibility of the Municipal Rabies Control Council.
 - j. For impounded pets, euthanasia shall be conducted on the **fifth (5th) working day from the date of capture**. For surrendered pets, euthanasia shall be conducted on the **third (3rd) day from the date of surrender**. On the **fourth (4th) day from the date of capture**, unclaimed dogs may be made available for adoption by **qualified persons**, subject to existing rules and guidelines.

Article VI. Funding

Section 25. Funding:

- a. An amount of One Million Pesos (P1,000,000.00) shall be appropriated out of the local treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to carry out the purposes of this Ordinance for the fiscal year 2026 ending on fiscal year 2027;
- b. For the succeeding years, such funds as may be necessary for the continued implementation of this Ordinance shall be appropriated by the Municipality either in the Municipal Annual Budget or in any of its supplemental budgets, as the case may be;

Article VII. Miscellaneous Provisions

Section 26. Repealing Clause.

All ordinances, resolutions, rules and regulations, or parts thereof, whose provisions are in conflict with or contrary to the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.

Section 27. Separability Clause.

If any section or provision of this ordinance is declared invalid, ultra vires or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

Section 28. Effectivity.

This ordinance shall take effect after 15 working days from the date a copy thereof is posted in a bulletin board at the entrance of the municipal hall and in at least two (2) other conspicuous places within the municipality and the gist thereof with penal provisions is published in a newspaper of general circulation within the province of Surigao del Sur.

Section 29. Let copy of this Ordinance be furnished to the 12 Barangays in the Municipality of Cortes for their information, guidance and reference.

The conduct and schedule of this public hearing was informed and announced through Bandillo and notices were posted in three conspicuous places of the twelve barangays of the municipality on January 28, 2026 which was set/scheduled on February 12, 2026 but was postponed because of the recently calamity Typhoon Basyang that hit/struck the municipality on February 5, 2026 thus re-scheduled today April 30, 2026.

The Public Hearing formally started at 1:00 o' clock in the afternoon and Mr. Gerly L. Lorono of LGU-Cortes was the Master of Ceremony.

5. Agenda:

1. Rabies Control Ordinance of the Municipality of Cortes

Proponent: Hon. Mercedette V. Dumagan, MPA
Committee on Agriculture and Fisheries

Hon. Mercedette V. Dumagan, MPA introduced the proposed Rabies Control Ordinance of the Municipality of Cortes, Surigao del Sur through an audiovisual presentation. She explained the rationale and objectives of the proposed measure, emphasizing the need to strengthen rabies prevention and control in the municipality, promote responsible pet ownership, protect public health and safety, and ensure the welfare of both the community and animals.

Mrs. Marilyn M. Mate, Agriculturist II, thereafter discussed the proposed ordinance in detail by presenting and explaining its provisions to the attending public. She translated the provisions into the Bisayan to make them more understandable and ensure that the participants clearly appreciated the intent and application of the proposed measure. She explained the salient features of the proposed ordinance, including the establishment of the Municipal Rabies Control Council (MRCC) and the Municipal Rabies Control Council-Technical Working Group (MRCC-TWG), the creation of the Barangay Rabies Control Desk, compulsory pet registration and annual rabies vaccination, pet identification, responsible pet ownership, mandatory castration, leash requirements, reporting protocols for animal bite incidents, and the responsibilities and liabilities of pet owners. She likewise discussed the provisions on the impoundment of stray animals, the establishment and operation of the municipal pound, the schedule of registration, vaccination, and other regulatory fees, the corresponding penalties for violations, enforcement mechanisms, and the funding and implementation of the ordinance. She further emphasized that the proposed measure aims to minimize rabies cases, reduce the incidence of animal bites, promote responsible pet ownership, and protect the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Municipality of Cortes.

6. Open Forum:

Hon. Mercedette V. Dumagan, MPA opened the floor for comments, questions, and suggestions from the attending public regarding the proposed ordinance.

Punong Barangay Russel M. Lavilla of Barangay Matho emphasized the need for the establishment of a municipal dog pound to ensure the proper impoundment of stray dogs before euthanasia is undertaken in accordance with existing laws and regulations. He explained the difficulty encountered by the barangays in apprehending stray dogs due to the absence of an appropriate impounding facility. He likewise proposed increasing the annual pet registration fee from ₱50.00 to ₱100.00 per pet to encourage responsible pet ownership and discourage individuals from keeping more animals than they can properly care for.

Mrs. Marilyn M. Mate, Agriculturist II, responded that the proposed ₱50.00 registration fee was carefully considered to encourage compliance among pet owners, noting that a higher fee might discourage registration, particularly for households with several dogs. She further informed the attendees that the procurement of dog leashes is already underway to support the implementation of the ordinance and the proper restraint of registered dogs.

Hon. Mercedette V. Dumagan, MPA thereafter sought the sentiment of the attendees regarding the proposed increase in the registration fee. After hearing the views of the participants, the majority favored retaining the proposed registration fee of ₱50.00 per pet.

Punong Barangay Mergjun L. Historia of Barangay Poblacion shared the barangay's experience in implementing dog apprehension activities and expressed concern over the lack of a permanent impounding facility and resources to sustain impounded animals. He appealed for the establishment of a municipal dog pound and assured the full cooperation of the barangays in implementing the ordinance once the necessary facilities and support are provided.

In response, Hon. Mercedette V. Dumagan, MPA assured the attendees that the establishment of a municipal dog pound forms part of the proposed ordinance and emphasized that the enactment of the measure would provide the legal basis for the allocation of funds and the strengthening of the municipality's rabies control and impoundment program.

Mrs. Marilyn M. Mate, Agriculturist II, likewise explained that while the Local Government Unit had previously undertaken dog apprehension activities, the absence of a local ordinance and a municipal dog pound limited its authority to fully implement rabies control measures. She further discussed the legal procedures governing the impoundment and euthanasia of unclaimed animals and informed the attendees that the Municipal Agriculture Office intends to conduct regular dog-catching operations, particularly in tourist areas, upon the enactment of the ordinance.

There being no further comments or questions from the attending public, Hon. Mercedette V. Dumagan, MPA called for a motion for the approval of the proposed ordinance. Kagawad Cubio of Barangay Matho moved for its approval, which was duly seconded by the attendees. There being no objection, the public hearing concluded with a unanimous consensus supporting the enactment of the proposed Rabies Control Ordinance of the Municipality of Cortes, Surigao del Sur.

7. Closing Remarks:

Hon. Cherry B. Daraman ended his closing remarks by thanking everyone sharing their valuable time in attending said activity.

8. Closing Prayer:

The Closing Prayer was led by Hon. Hazel G. Pasok.

The Public Hearing ended at exactly 5:30 in the afternoon.
