SECTION 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as the **Amended Curfew and Public Order Ordinance of the Municipality of Cantilan.**

SECTION 2. REGULATED ACTS. No person below eighteen (18) years of age shall be allowed to loiter, walk around, stay, or be present in any street or public place from **10:00 P.M. to 4:00 A.M.**, except in the following instances:

1. Minors attending evening school activities with proper authorization;
2. Attendance in social gatherings (birthdays, weddings, and similar occasions) accompanied by parents or guardians;
3. Medical emergencies;
4. Religious activities such as vigils, wakes, and similar observances;
5. Attendance at officially recognized fiesta celebrations, civic festivities, cultural activities, and other community events sanctioned by the Municipal Government or Barangay Government, provided that the minor is accompanied by a parent, guardian, or responsible adult;
6. Other emergency situations not detrimental to minors.

SECTION 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS. For purposes of this Ordinance, the following terms are defined as follows:

- a. **Minor** – any person below eighteen (18) years of age;
- b. **Curfew** – restriction requiring minors to remain indoors during designated hours;
- c. **Curfew Hours** – from 10:00 P.M. to 4:00 A.M.;
- d. **Public Place** – includes streets, parks, plazas, establishments, and all areas open to the public within the Municipality of Cantilan;
- e. **Special Permit** – a written authorization issued by the Municipal Government allowing an establishment or organizer to operate beyond the prescribed hours under conditions specified therein.

SECTION 4. ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS ON BUSINESS OPERATIONS AND NOISE CONTROL.

To strengthen peace and order, the following rules are hereby imposed:

A. Night Bars / Disco Bars / Restobars

1. Cut-off time for orders shall be **12:30 A.M.**
2. Sound systems and music must be lowered starting **12:00 Midnight.**
3. Closing time shall be **2:00 A.M.**
4. No minors shall be allowed within the premises during curfew hours.
5. Establishments shall maintain peace and order within and immediately outside their premises.

B. Videoke / Karaoke

1. Open-air videoke, outdoor karaoke, and establishments without approved soundproofing facilities shall be allowed to operate only until **10:00 P.M.**, except during permitted fiestas, civic celebrations, and special events duly authorized by the Municipal Government.
2. Establishments with approved soundproofing facilities or enclosed sound-controlled areas may be allowed to operate beyond **10:00 P.M.**, subject to inspection, certification, and approval by the Municipal Government, provided that no noise

disturbance is caused to nearby residents or surrounding communities. The allowable operating hours shall be specified in the permit issued for such purpose.

C. Computer Shops / Internet Cafés

1. Operating hours shall be until **10:00 P.M. only**.
2. No minors shall be allowed inside the establishment during curfew hours except as may be allowed by law or when accompanied by a parent or guardian for a lawful purpose.
3. Students enrolled in elementary and secondary schools shall not be allowed to stay, play, browse, or use the facilities of computer shops, internet cafés, and similar establishments during official school hours on regular school days, unless accompanied by a parent, guardian, teacher, or authorized school representative for educational or school-related activities.
4. Owners, operators, and personnel of computer shops and internet cafés shall exercise due diligence in preventing students from loitering or utilizing the establishment during class hours and may require presentation of a valid school identification card or other proof of identity when necessary.
5. Any computer shop, internet café, or similar establishment found permitting students to use its facilities during regular class hours without a lawful or authorized purpose shall be subject to the penalties provided under this Ordinance.

D. Billiard Halls / Billiard Establishments

1. Operating hours shall be until **10:00 P.M. only**.
2. No minor shall be allowed to stay, play, loiter, or remain inside any billiard hall or billiard establishment during curfew hours, except as may be allowed by law or when accompanied by a parent or guardian for a lawful purpose.
3. Students enrolled in elementary and secondary schools shall not be allowed to stay, play, or use the facilities of billiard halls or billiard establishments during official school hours on regular school days, unless participating in a school-authorized activity and accompanied by a teacher, coach, parent, guardian, or authorized school representative.
4. Owners, operators, and personnel of billiard halls or billiard establishments shall exercise due diligence in preventing minors and students from violating the provisions of this Ordinance and may require the presentation of a valid school identification card or other proof of identity when necessary.
5. Billiard tournaments, competitions, leagues, and similar organized events may be allowed to extend beyond the prescribed operating hours, provided that the organizer, owner, or operator secures a **Special Permit** from the Municipal Government of Cantilan prior to the conduct of such event.
6. The Special Permit shall indicate the approved date, duration, and allowable operating hours of the tournament or event and may contain such conditions as may be necessary to ensure public safety, peace and order, and compliance with existing laws and ordinances.
7. Any billiard hall or billiard establishment operating beyond the prescribed hours without the required Special Permit, or violating the conditions of an issued permit, shall be subject to the penalties provided under this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. PENALTY CLAUSE

A. For Minors Violating Curfew

1. First Offense – Warning; release to parent/guardian; mandatory counseling;
2. Second Offense – Parental conference;
3. Third and Succeeding Offenses – Referral to the MSWDO.

B. For Parents/Guardians

1. First Offense – Warning and mandatory counseling/seminar;
2. Second Offense – Fine of **₱1,000.00**;
3. Third Offense – Fine of **₱2,000.00**;
4. Fourth and Succeeding Offenses – Fine of **₱2,500.00**.

C. For Business Establishments

1. First Offense – Fine of **₱1,500.00** and warning;
2. Second Offense – Fine of **₱2,000.00**;
3. Third Offense – Fine of **₱2,500.00** and suspension of permit for up to seven (7) days;
4. Fourth and Succeeding Offenses – Revocation of permit.

D. Specific Violations

1. Allowing minors during curfew hours – **₱1,500.00 per incident**;
2. Violation of operating hours or noise-control regulations – **₱2,500.00**;
3. Operating beyond authorized hours without the required Special Permit – **₱2,500.00**;
4. Permitting students to stay or use computer shops, internet cafés, or billiard establishments during regular class hours without lawful or authorized purpose – **₱2,500.00**.

E. Anti-Corruption. Any bribery, extortion, or unlawful consideration related to the enforcement of this Ordinance shall be dealt with in accordance with existing laws, rules, and regulations.

SECTION 6. ENFORCEMENT. This Ordinance shall be enforced through coordination among the Philippine National Police (PNP), Barangay Officials, Barangay Council for the Protection of Children (BCPC), Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO), Business Permits and Licensing Office (BPLO), and the Municipal Government.

A. Philippine National Police (PNP)

- Lead enforcement, patrols, and lawful apprehensions;
- Ensure child-friendly handling of minors;
- Document violations and coordinate with concerned agencies;
- Subject to personnel availability and operational requirements, provide police visibility and security assistance, particularly every Friday and Saturday from **12:30 A.M. to 2:00 A.M.**, to maintain peace and order and ensure the orderly dispersal of patrons after business hours.

B. Barangay Officials

- Monitor implementation;
- Conduct initial intervention;
- Maintain records and assist in enforcement activities.

C. BCPC

- Ensure child protection;
- Provide counseling and intervention;
- Monitor repeat offenders.

D. MSWDO

- Provide counseling, case management, and intervention programs;
- Conduct parenting seminars and rehabilitation efforts.

E. BPLO / Municipal Office

- Inspect establishments;
- Issue notices of violation;
- Enforce permit suspension or revocation;
- Conduct inspection and certification of soundproofing facilities and other noise-control measures for establishments seeking exemptions under this Ordinance;
- Process and recommend approval or denial of applications for Special Permits.

F. Due Process. All actions undertaken pursuant to this Ordinance shall be documented and carried out in accordance with existing laws and child protection policies.

SECTION 7. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any provision of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 8. REPEALING CLAUSE. All ordinances, resolutions, executive orders, rules, regulations, or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.

SECTION 9. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE. This Ordinance shall take effect upon approval and after posting in conspicuous places within the Municipality of Cantilan for at least ten (10) consecutive days in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.

SECTION 2. REGULATED ACTS. No person below 18 years of age shall be allowed to loiter, walk around or be in the streets, or stay in any public place from 11:00 PM to 4:00 PM everyday, except for the following instances:

1. Minor students attending evening school activities and parties, in which case, permits shall be issued to said minors by their respective school heads and principals, and the same shall be presented to any apprehending police officer;
2. Parties or social activities sponsored by governmental or non – governmental organizations, and/or birthday or wedding, anniversaries, provided that said minors shall be accompanied by their respective parents, relatives or persons of responsible age;
3. Injured or sick persons being brought out for medical treatment;
4. Religious vigil or wake for dead persons;
5. Other emergency cases which are not detrimental to physical and moral wellbeing of minors.

SECTION 2. DEFINITION OF TERMS as used in this ordinance:

1. MINOR – any person below 18 years of age;
2. CURFEW – a municipal order or regulation that direct civilians, in this case the minors, to keep off the streets and public places during designated hours; a police or military regulation that direct civilians to keep off the streets after designated hours; also a municipal order of the same tenor applying to children only;
3. 11:00 PM TO 4:00 AM – the specific designated hours during which minors are prohibited from going out, roaming around the streets or hang out in public places;
4. PUBLIC PLACE – includes all kinds of roads, streets, parks, plazas, beaches, moviehouses, showhouses, and such other places open to the public within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality of Cantilan.

SECTION 3. PENALTY CLAUSE:

1. Violation of any provision of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not less than P50.00 but not more than P200.00, or imprisonment of not less than 3 days but not more than 5 days, or both fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court.
2. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or any agent or employee thereof to give or offer, directly or indirectly, to any police officer authorized to perform the duty prescribed in this ordinance, any monetary consideration or something for pleasure, things of value with intent to influence such peace officer in the discharge of his/her duty as to violate directly or indirectly any provisions of this ordinance.

It shall likewise be unlawful under these regulations for any peace officer or other employees engaged in the performance of any duty prescribed under this ordinance to accept from any person, individual any gift, money, or any other form for pleasure, or other things of value given with intent to influence his/her official actions.

Such offense shall be fined not less than P1,000.00 but not more than P2,000.00, or be suspended/terminated from service, or both fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court, without prejudice to any administrative liability.

SECTION 4. REPEALING CLAUSE. All ordinances, resolutions, rules and regulations, or parts thereof, the provisions of which are in conflict with or contrary to the provisions of this ordinance, are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.

SECTION 5.EFFECTIVITY. This ordinance shall take effect upon its approval, after being posted for 10 consecutive days in 3 conspicuous places in this municipality.

NOW THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Jimbo A. Luarez, unanimously seconded, it was;

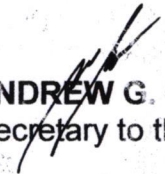

RESOLVED FURTHER, that all concerned stakeholders, government agencies, and interested members of the public are hereby invited to attend and participate in the said public hearing;

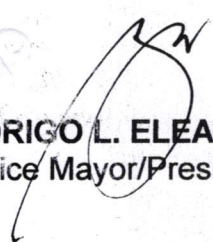

EXCERPT FROM THE MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARING HELD AT CANTILAN
SPORTING CLUB COVERED COURT LAST 4 JUNE 2026

(1) CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order at 10:25 in the morning.

(2) OPENING PRAYER: Led by SB Member John Elven G. Vega

- 1. Draft Ordinance introduced by SB Member and ABC PRESIDENT Jimbo A. Luarez, entitled, "AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING 11:00 PM TO 4:00 AM CURFEW HOURS ON MINORS TO PROTECT THEM FROM HARM OR ANY FORM OF ATTACK THAT MAY RESULT TO INJURY TO THEIR PERSON BY ANYBODY WHOSE TARGETS ARE MINORS, "BY PROVIDING ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS ON BUSINESS OPERATING HOURS, NOISE CONTROL, AND RELATED MATTERS."**

The proponent of the Ordinance, Hon. Jimbo A. Luarez, presided during the public hearing. He made a short statement regarding the ordinance which is part of public service. A power point presentation was made.

Mr. Edgardo Diaz, one of the attendees, pointed out letter "C" of the ordinance on page 2. He said that it is significant as CCTV's are effective deterrent of committing crimes, hence, it shall be required for computer shops. He said he heard a number of complaints regarding theft happening within the jurisdiction of Cantilan, Surigao del Sur.

Hon. Jimbo A. Luarez said that there is a separate ordinance regarding the CCTV installations in some business establishments and some strategic public areas.

Mr. Edgardo Diaz asked a clarificatory question regarding Section 5 on who will conduct the mandatory counselling for minors.

Hon. Jimbo A. Luarez answered that it will be the task of the DSWD.

Mr. Dawn Arreza, another attendee, questioned about the limits for videoke operations.

Hon Jimbo A. Luarez said that open videoke houses are limited until 10 in the evening to operate. For sound proofed videoke houses will be allowed to operated beyond 10 in the evening but the sounds will be in moderation.

Brgy. Kagawad Jesus Ortega, on his part, pointed some observations in relation to peace and order that needs to be addressed. They are as follows:

1. How many CCTV are required to be installed?
2. How many days can a CCTV operate and how many months will be the recording time?
3. Disco houses should be required to hire security personnel.

4. Aside from security personnel, health certificate shall also be required for crew at videoke houses and discobars.

Hon. Jimbo A. Luarez noted the suggestions. He also mentioned that billiard halls shall be required to install CCTV's.

Brgy. Kagawad Jesus Orega of Magosilom, also mentioned about amusement establishment like basketball, volleyball, tennis and pickleball courts, to include resorts.

Hon. Jimbo A. Luarez asked the PNP personnel present to comment.

The representative from the PNP, PMSG Elmer B. Ellazo, only wanted to clarify on the curfew hours.

Ms. Doris Sering of Hillary's Café requested that if possible there will be police presence during their closing time as part of police visibility as there were a number of instances that commotion happens outside the premises after operating hours.

SB Member Genito B. Guardo asked on what days that there are volume of disco goers.

Ms. Doris Sering answered during Fridays and Saturdays.

Brgy. Kagawad Jesus Ortega suggested that parked vehicles outside these establishments shall be organized.

Hon. Jimbo A. Luarez said that the suggestion was well taken and it be contained in the IRR.

Brgy. Kagawad Elvis Plaza of Palasao, asked if there be any exemptions during fiestas and Araw nan mga Baragays in the implementation of the said ordinance.

Hon. Jimbo A. Luarez said that the mentioned days are exempted.

SB Member Genito B. Guardo commented that the PNP personnel in Cantilan is undermanned as to the ration. He said that he talked to the PNP Chief that and the ration of one policeman to constituents is 1: 1,400. He also pointed that police personnel cannot immediately respond to calls because of their limited personnel that is why it is important that cooperation between the PNP and the general public shall be observed.

Ms. Janice Ocura, from Cantilan Pilot School, was thankful that such ordinance was being crafted as this will not only promote peace and order but also provide more time for students to study and the development of the learners will be wholistic. Learners can also have more time for bonding with their respective families. She added that during school days they will conduct a GPTA meeting and inform the attendees that such ordinance is existing and to be imposed within Cantilan Pilot School together with their learners.

Pastor Petros asked regarding the PLEB if it ever existed.

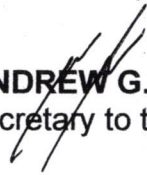

Hon. Jimbo A. Luarez emphasized that internet cafes who operated in violation of the said ordinance may be subjected to closure.

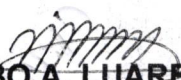
With no more discussions to be made, Mr. Edgardo Diaz moved for the adjournment of the public hearing.

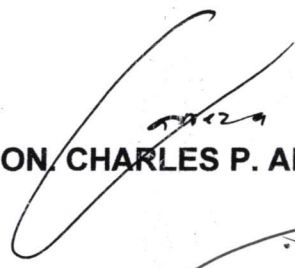
